## LOCATION SCOUTING CHECKLIST

## Room/Space

	_Room Size - For an interview, the room should be a minimum of 10x10 ft. Ideally, 20x12 or larger is best for green screen shooting. Room size is dependent on your production requirements.
	Room Availability - Is the room available for one hour before shooting is schedule to begin (for load-in and set-up) and one half hour after shooting is completed (for tear-down and load-out)?
	Controllable lighting - Can lights be shut off if needed? Are there dimmers? Are there windows and if so are there blinds or curtains that can be used to block out sunlight if needed?
	Inform the crew if there are uncontrollable lighting conditions so they can bring appropriate gear.
	Noise/Sound – Is the ambient noise level acceptable? Are there noise sources that cannot be controlled such as traffic, airplanes and/or people talking?
	Inform the crew if there are uncontrollable audio conditions so they can bring appropriate gear.
	_ Who is the on-site contact person?
	What is the address/phone number of the venue?
Crew and Talent	
	Where should the crew enter to load in the equipment? (Address and door location)
	Where should the crew or talent park their vehicles?
	_ Is there a room nearby the shooting location for the crew to store cases and extra equipment?
	_ Is there a room or area that could be used for a make-up stylist to work (if needed)?
Logistics	
	_ Is there a room or area that can be used set-up food and water (if required)?
	_ Are there people that need to be informed about the shoot? (Hospital PR Department, security staff, etc.)
	Are any special permissions, insurance documents or permits required to shoot in the location?
	_ Is there a fee for using the location?
	Do you have weather contingencies if the shoot can be affected by weather?  (Alternate shoot dates, indoor location option)
	Room décor - Are there just bare walls? Are there any pictures or plants in the room? If needed, are there any plants, pictures, etc. at the facility that could be moved and used for background elements? (If not, you may need to bring some set "decorations")
	Are there facilities staff that should be alerted that you will be using lighting equipment that could possibly blow a circuit breaker? If there isn't a facilities staff, determine the location of the circuit breaker box that supplies power to your location area.
